### ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Below is a summary of the State of Washington's PIRL submission:

- 2,447 total errors were addressed with hardcoded values, in order to pass WIPS edit checks successfully.
  - 1,646 total records were hardcoded with a value of zero, where the "Highest School Grade Completed" was unavailable.
  - 605 total records were hardcoded with the "School Status at Program Entry" status, where the "School Status at Exit" status was unavailable.
  - 103 total records were hardcoded to remove "Category of Assessment" when the pre-test wasn't present.
  - 82 unique records were hardcoded, in order to pass various other WIPS edit checks successfully.
- A/RTAA data prior to May 2019 was not available for reporting due to technical issues.
