- 1. Hiring
- Is it harder for farmworkers to apply, or are the local workers even applying for the jobs because they believe that these jobs are already being done by the H-2A workers?
- 2. Worker union Perspective:
- Domestics go to the farms that have H-2A workers- local workers are being offerred a lower wage than H-2A.
- 40hrs a week guaranteed for H-2A workers, not for local (skagit, whatcom counties)
- Fear of retailiation if the community finds out that a complaint was made.
- 3. Advisory Chair reminded the group to not specify the Employers names as this is an open, public meeting.

Monitoring and Audit Updates: OFLC Monitoring (August 2023)



Office of Foreign Labor Certification (OFLC) Audit Outcome

Action needed: Updated inter-agency plan for H-2A temporary worker housing inspections.

Current Status:

- ESD coordinating with Washington LNI and DOH to develop and implement an <u>updated</u>
 agreement regarding H-2A Temporary Worker Housing. (Roles and responsibilities, timeframes,
 communication, record keeping, complaint coordination, etc.) Completion timeframe: 6-12
 months.
- LNI and DOH policy representatives will submit a proposal to ESD regarding roles and responsibilities in February 2024.
- ASWS will continue to brief committee as agreement evolves.

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Monitoring and Audit Updates: JLARC Audit (2022-2023)



Joint Legislative Audit and Review Committee

- ESD's Response to JLARC Preliminary Audit Report Findings (in committee's pre-meeting materials)
 - Submitted to JLARC on 2/8/2024 (ESD was granted two-week due date extension)
 - LNI, DOH, and WSDA will submit supplemental, concurring responses.
- Final JLARC report and JLARC hearing in April 2024
- Next Steps:
 - ESD engaging with LNI DOSH and DOH for inter-agency agreements for field check coordination in 2024.





Legislative update



House Bill 2226 - H-2A and Fruit Harvester Survey

- Directs the Employment Security to survey H-2A workers during field checks and field visits and report the results to the ASWS committee.
- Directs the Department to conduct a comprehensive wage survey of workers hand harvesting (in person and phone):
 - Apples
 - Cherries
 - Pears
 - Blueberries

- The bill was passed by the House on February 7 (54 yeas, 42 nays)
- The Senate Labor & Commerce Committee voted the bill out of committee on February 15
- This survey prescribed in the bill will replace the current worker survey conducted by the Department
- Bill was amended in the Senate that allows for flexibility between the responses from phone and field surveys

ADDENDUM V.

Legislative update



2024 Agricultural and Seasonal Workforce Services Report

<u>RCW 50.75.040(4)</u> directs the committee to report to the Governor and the Legislature on:

- Recommended approaches to improve ESD's recruitment process as part of the H-2A application, including recommended changes to state law if appropriate
- Analysis of costs incurred to administer the H-2A program and funds for other farmworker programs, including federal funds provided for the H-2A program
