The Employment Security Department intends to expand access to this program by removing the requirement that an employer be legally registered in the state for at least six months before qualifying for the Shared Work program.

Reasons supporting proposal: In February of 2020, Governor Inslee proclaimed a State of Emergency in Washington in response to COVID-19. The Department filed a series of emergency rules to support the state's emergency response, one of which expanded access to the Shared Work program. There are two spots in WAC Chapter 192-250 where employers who have been registered in Washington for six months or less are excluded from participating in the Shared Work program: the entirety of WAC 192-250-015 and WAC 192-250-045(2)(c). Rules adopted under WSR 21-13-007 deleted WAC 192-250-045(2)(c) but failed to repeal WAC 192-250-015. By adding a repeal of WAC 192-250-015, the Department is following through with the policy that employers who have been registered employers for six months or less can still participate in Shared Work, thereby leaving that program open to more employers and their employees. Statutory authority for adoption: Under RCW 50.60.030, the Commissioner shall approve a shared work compensation plan if certain criteria are met; the Commissioner may also take into account any other factors which may be pertinent.
