This rulemaking will also allow the Department to consider waivers for claimants with overpayments resulting from a discharge for misconduct that occurred from February 2, 2020, through September 4, 2021. Reasons supporting proposal: The Department's current overpayment waiver emergency rules must be adopted as permanent rules so that all applications can be processed under those rules. Additionally, in order to expand the availability of overpayment waivers to individuals impacted by the pandemic, the eligibility for waiver of overpayment should be extended to
