proposal is to permanently adopt the Department's emergency rules providing flexibility and relief to claimants and employers who are impacted by wildfires and other disasters. These rules address the requirements that an unemployed individual be able and available for work and the requirement that individuals make satisfactory progress in their training to receive training benefits. These rules also address the circumstances when employers can receive relief of benefit charges for individuals who become unemployed due to a catastrophic occurrence.
